A NON-AVID Student is a Student Who...

- is at-risk and struggles with basic academic skills.
- receives numerous D's and F's in regular-track courses.
- has no motivation and is not committed to working hard (even though academic potential is present).
- is not committed to working hard outside class and doing homework.
- will more than likely struggle in pre-AP and AP coursework, even with support.
- is unsure about attending college.
- exhibits unacceptable behavior and is uncooperative in AVID and/or in other classes.
